Includes short learning checks throughout and a certificate of completion.

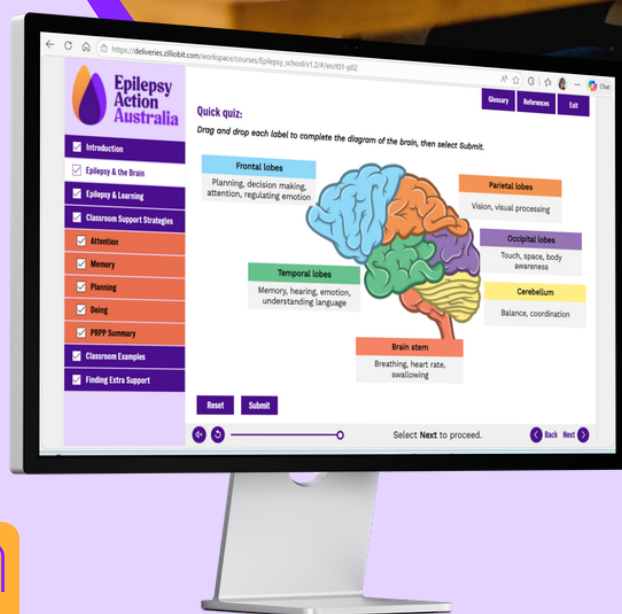

A practical, interactive tool to help you understand and support any child in your class with epilepsy.

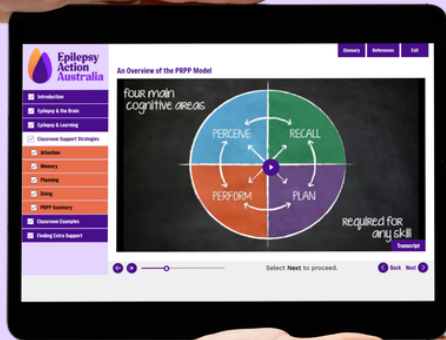
Answer simple questions based on what you observe in the classroom to identify strengths and challenges across key thinking skills - including attention, memory, planning and task completion.
